2012 Summer Residential Governor's Schools

(open to Junior & Sophomores)

The Governor's School programs were established in 1973 by Governor Linwood Holton for 400 gifted students from across Virginia. The programs have expanded to serving more than 7500 gifted students from all parts of the Commonwealth.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Students focus on one special area of intellectual or artistic strength and study in a way that best suits the gifted learner's needs.
- Each program stresses non-traditional teaching and learning techniques. Students are involved in classroom and laboratory work, field studies, research, individual and group projects and performances, and seminars with noted scholars, visiting artists, and other professionals.
- Students live on a college campus up to 5 weeks during the summer. They have the opportunity to live, study and get to know other students with similar abilities and interests from across Virginia.
- Recreation activities and free time are provided.
- Tuition is paid for by the Virginia Department of Education and FCPS; only incidental fees (including transportation to and from the program) and spending money would be needed by attendees.

- o Academic/Mentorship Programs (MST, HUM and 3 Mentorships 6 Applications
- * Visual and Performing Arts students participate in a statewide adjudication where they audition or present portfolios for review before a pair of professionals in the specific arts field. These scores will determine which students will ultimately submit a final application. (Students will not receive their adjudication scores.) This year's adjudication will take place at George Mason University on Saturday, January 21.
- ** *Mentorship* students are selected to work side by side with research scientists, physicians and a variety of other professionals. Applicants to these programs must be juniors. The most competitive applicants demonstrate previous research experiences, beyond the typical requirements of high school courses.

HOW ARE STUDENTS SELECTED?

Chantilly High School will complete a preliminary review of all interested junior and sophomore students and identify those students who will proceed with the full application process. A faculty committee will review each application to select the final applicants to represent Chantilly High School at the Fairfax County level. Fairfax County will then select the final applicants to move on to final consideration by the state.

Submission of an interest form or completed application does <u>not</u> guarantee selection by Chantilly High School, Fairfax County or the Commonwealth of Virginia. Any student submitting an interest form must be serious in their commitment to attend and participate in the program in its entirety.

- 2) <u>Submit Page 1</u> with your Personal Information, Program Choice, and High School Information <u>Division Name</u> = "Fairfax County Public Schools"

- 3) <u>Submit Page 2</u> in its entirety. If you would like to include additional information please attach a sheet and use the *same* format. (<u>Do not be modest</u> including anything that might fit from the past three years.)
- 4) <u>Submit the Signatures Form (page 3 for VPA/page 4 for AG, HUM, and MST/page 8 for Mentorship)</u> with your Parent/Guardian signature and initials, as well as your own initials. This indicates that you understand the commitment that you make to this process and to ultimately attend Governor's School if you are selected.
- **5)** Consider who you will ask for Recommendations and <u>Submit the Names/E-Mail Addresses for those who you would ask</u>, should you move forward in the process. (You do not need to submit letters at this time!) Submit this information on a separate sheet of paper, with your full name and intended Governor's School program.
